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FROM THE DEPUTY ENGINEER

On May 29th, Jim, Matt and I attended the first hearing for the Miller Tile Petition, Project No. 141. After a few questions from the audience, the Commissioners decided to move forward with the project. The next step is to perform interviews, calculate assessments and come up with construction plans. The final hearing will be scheduled after this process is completed. The Miller Tile petition is located in Green Creek Twp. It was filed in order to alleviate flooding behind yards and farm fields along TR 183, CR 175 and TR 195. Just this past week, our guys lowered and extended our 60" Concrete Pipe on TR 195 that will be the outlet for this Miller Tile Petition. The pipe was lowered 2.4' in order to give this project fall and a proper outlet. The next petition on the schedule is the Hofelich Ditch, with the first hearing scheduled for July 1st.

M&B completed the paving on CR 92 and CR 109. Pavement markings were installed last weekend and RPM's are being installed today. Next on the schedule for M&B is the CR 247, 260, 268 paving and widening project. They will pave this sometime in July. Our road crew has been busy preparing for this project. Some crossovers were replaced and other miscellaneous extensions and catch basins were added or replaced. Now we are ready for paving.

After all of our spring projects (Fangboner Rd., CR 294 cleanup, CR 247 cleanup, several culvert replacements, sinkhole repairs, etc.), we finally made it over to the RY 244 Bridge this week. Our guys will be completing all of the drainage work around the bridge this week and will be starting on the actual bridge construction next week. This project has been delayed several times, mainly due to the weather. Let's hope that we are blessed this summer with better weather than the last. TR 244 and TR 239 will be closed to traffic during the duration of this bridge project.

ROAD MAINTENANCE

- Culverts on CR 247 have now been completed.
- Mark and his crew replaced a 30 inch and also a 24 inch culvert under CR 247.
- Another crew spent some time on CR 268 resetting a catch basin back away from the roadway for paving and road widening.
- Broken tiles were repaired on CR 247, 198, and Fangboner.
- About 200 ft. of ditch was enclosed on Smith Rd.
- Culverts on CR 268 and on 294 were replaced with 12 inch RCP.
- A 60 inch culvert was lowered on Twp. 195 for a ditch petition project.
- Bridge forms were loaded into the new form racks.
- Dirt work continues on Fangboner as weather allows.
- Road side mowing has been going on for about a month now. Crews are on the east side of the county now and mowing everything. Looking good out there.
- Catch basins on CR 229 and 198 were repaired.
- A walk in door in building #1 was replaced.
- Areas around town are being kept mowed.

The TR 244 bridge replacement will start next week. A crew has been out there the past couple of days installing drainage tile in the ditches. This will give us some areas to put the dirt that is produced.
