It looks like the winter season is fading away and spring is moving in. The grass is greening up and temperatures have been pretty decent in the 50s and 60s. We may get a cold spell over the weekend, but back to the 50s next week. With not much snow this season, our salt usage was down. We used approx. 1300 tons of salt and 500 tons of #9 stone. After receiving the last order of salt, our salt shed is pretty well full. We are definitely ready for next winter season.

Mark has been up on TR 260, cleaning up a ditch along the road. We removed the brush and trees with our new grinder attachment for the excavator. The machine worked out well once we got the hydraulic flow rate set right. It is going to be a useful tool in the future. With the brush out of the way, he has been straightening and reshaping the banks. When finished with this ditch, we are going to move into the construction mode.

We will be getting started on the CR 32 bridge project. Hopefully the rains and high water stay away this year.
