I have been working on a RUMA in anticipation of the proposed pipelines. The Townships' hired an attorney who has reviewed it and recommended some changes. Those changes have been made, so once he reviews it one more time, hopefully it will be finalized.

FROM THE ROAD SUPERINTENDENT

Most of our bigger projects have now been completed. We still have a 36" culvert to extend on Twp. Rd. 278. We have been trying to get in some of the maintenance work here done before the cold temperature come. Jobs like bridge repairs, asphalt repairs, and berm reclaiming to name a few.

ROAD MAINTENANCE

- The boom mower is just about done with our roads. We will then be helping out the townships on their larger ditches.
- A large washout and separated tile was repaired on Port Clinton Rd. Also a sink hole was investigated on East State St.
- Catch basins on Finefrock Rd. and on TR 220 were raised.
- Two catch basins on East State St. were repaired.
- Dirt work was finished on CR 185 and seeded. The new grass is coming in pretty well.
- The culvert we replaced on TR 126 was spot paved.
- The rest of the dirt from CR 128 ditch cleaning was hauled to the yard.
